

The concluding part of the work comprises discussions of current research topics, such as problems of big-bang cosmology, quantum fields in curved spacetimes, quantum cosmology, Kaluza – Klein theories, supersymmetry, supergravity and superstrings. In addition, special articles on relevant mathematical topics are included.

The book covers a wide range of topics which are at the forefront of current research interests, and may serve to inspire and guide the student in these different areas, starting from first principles and leading up to the most modern developments.

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
